

Fellison's Barn Burned.

About six o'clock this evening, during the electric storm, the large barn on Ed. Fellison's farm six miles northeast of Wimbledon, was struck by lightning and burned to the ground. The mow was full of new hay and a bin containing 500 bushels of oats was all destroyed. Five of their best horses were in the barn at the time and Mr. Fellison was at Wimbledon working on his new residence, but his good wife was equal to the occasion and went into the burning building, and by the use of a knife, cut the tie ropes and drove the horses out. She experienced great difficulty in getting out and was completely exhausted from the intense heat and smoke. Dr. Wanner was called and attended her and we learn to-day she has entirely recovered. Few men would have attempted what this woman accomplished.

The grain and building was insured for \$1200 and Mr. Fellison will re-build at once.
