DIES AT THE HOME OF HIS
JOHN, JR., IN JAMESTOWN
BURIED HERE.

John Siebert, Sr., one of the most highly respected and known men of this part of the state, passed away last Monday morning at 10:30, at the home of his son, John, in Jamestown.

Mr. Siebert was born in the year 1839, in Germany, and came to this country in 1892, located on a homestead west of Centenary, living on and farming the same up until three years ago, at which time he gave up the arduous labors of the farm and made his home with his son, Herman, who, about nine months ago, met death in a runaway, being thrown out of a wagon. Since the death of Herman, he has made his home with his son, John, Jr., and removed him to Jamestown some time ago. He was the owner of 160 acres of land near here at the time of his death.

He was one of the well known farmers in this community, had friends by the score, all of whom speak in the very best tones of his friendship.

He leaves to mourn his death three children, two sons, John, Jr., and Anton, and one daughter, Mary, besides other relatives and numerous friends.

The body was brought to Centenary, Wednesday evening, and taken to the home of John Barski, west of town. Burial was from the St. Mary's church Thursday morning at 10:30, the remains were laid to rest in the cemetery at the church, the services being conducted by Father Sailer of Valley City.
