

# A New School Building

DECIDED BY THE PEOPLE AT THE  
SCHOOL ELECTION HELD  
TUESDAY

The election for one member on the board of directors for the school for a term of three years was held Tuesday afternoon, voting being from 2 to 5. A small vote was cast, only 75 voters, including the women, turned out. The ballot contained but one name, that of W. F. Moffett, who was appointed on the board about a year ago to fill an unexpired term, and who received 65 votes. Mrs. Geo. Tucker's name was written in and she received nine votes. Billy Reid was accused of voting for himself, owing to the fact that he got one vote, but Billy says he did not.

The most important matter to be voted on at the election, was the issuing of bonds to the extent of \$21,000 for the purpose of building a new school house for Courtenay. There seemed a question of the bonds being voted in, but after the ballots were counted, it was found that 49 voted for the new building, to 27 who did not want it.

The new school will be started as soon as possible and will be one of the most up-to-date and finest that this amount of money can build. This is something that has been needed for several years, and everyone in this township should be glad that such a necessity is to be realized.
