

## RETURNED HOME—

Joseph Orandall returned to his home near Medina to spend the holidays with his family. The old resident and noted wolf hunter of Stutsman county was returning from Hingham, Mont., a new town on the Great Northern, 35 miles west of Havre, where he has been breaking with a steam plowing outfit for homesteaders. He turned over some 1300 acres before threshing started. The country is fast settling up—the homesteaders taking the reclaimed land in half section homesteads. An excellent crop was harvested this fall, flax yielding from 10 to 19 bushels, winter wheat 18 to 30 and spring wheat 15 to 26 bushels per acre. No snow is on the ground, although there was a slight fall Sept. 12. Mr. Orandall left for Montana, March 27th, and during his stay participated in a successful deer hunt near Glacier park in the Rockies, killing three fine bucks. He also visited Lake McDonald.—Jamestown Alert.
