As it was he suffered great pain, his foot being twist-ed just below the ankle. It was impossible for the doctor to determine whether any of bones were broken. He was put on the early morn-

ing flyer and taken to his home in Enderlin, where an x-ray exâmination was made. Dr. Shepard accompanied him as far as Valley City and states that he was suffering great pain at that time, but he anticipated that nothing serious would be the
