

# OBITUARY

Mrs. M. J. Mossing was born in Norway on the 11th of December, 1848, where she resided until she was six years old, when she came with her parents to the United States, and settled in Pierce County, Wisconsin in 1864. She was confirmed by Pastor Thoreson in the Rush River Church there when sixteen years old. She was married in River Falls, Wis., the 6th of October 1864, and moved with her husband to Griggs county, North Dakota, where they lived on a homestead east of Walum for 20 years, when they moved into Walum where Mr. Mossing was in business for three years. While living near Walum Mrs. Mossing was one of those who organized the St. Olaf's Ladies Aid. In the year 1908 she moved with her husband and children to Canada where they settled on a homestead near Viceroy, Sack. There she lived until she was called to the Great Beyond on the 2nd of April 1922, after having suffered for about a year with cancer.

Mrs. Mossing was the first president of the St. Olaf Ladies Aid. She was always active in church work, and was well liked by all who knew her; a faithful and patient wife and mother.

She is survived by her husband, four boys, Carl, Oscar, Bernard and Arthur, two girls, Mrs. Olaf Bakke and Mrs. Axel Wenaus, all of whom reside in Canada. One son Christian died in 1900.

Mrs. Mossing was well known in this community and the Enterprise joins her many friends in extending sympathy to the grief stricken family.
