

Visitors from Wisconsin

Attorney and Mrs. Hans A. Anderson, of Whitehall, Wis., were here the past week visiting at the home of Miss Louise Kaas. They were on their way to Montana to visit their daughters. Mr. Anderson has been county judge for several years and at the last session was a member of the State Assembly.

Mr. Anderson took great interest in re-visiting this neighborhood, because it is just 40 years this summer since he made his first visit here. At that time it was necessary for him to walk from Sanborn to the Eimon ranch as the branch line had not yet been built. There were no roads, but the country had recently been surveyed, and he followed the section lines and could always tell his location by reading the markings on the section stakes. It was frequently necessary to wade through waist high water in the sloughs.

That same year he worked for a while with a railroad construction crew out of Jamestown, and had an opportunity to see probably the last buffalo in this section of the country. Cowboys immediately went in pursuit of the animal, but it got into the timbered river valley and escaped the hunters.

Sunday Mr. Anderson re-visited the Eimon ranch, visited the Christ Jackson home, called on Miss Eimon at Sutton, and attended the afternoon session of the Lutheran convention at Binford.
