Democrats in Third Place

In South Dakota where three major political parties contended for recognition in the recent election, the result of that contest shows that the Republicans gained a most tremendous victory. This is best demonstrated by the comparative strength each of those three parties will have in the state legislature of that state. In the state Senate the Republicans will have 42 members, the Nonpartisan League 2 and the Democrats 1. The House of Representatives will be composed of 93, Republicans, 7 Nonpartisan Leaguers, and 3 Democrats. From these numbers it will be seen that the Democratic party is third in strength.

Two years ago 20 Leaguers held seats in the South Dakota legislature. According to the Richards Primary Law, the Nonpartisan League will in the future go on the ballots as a distinct party and can not work through either of the other parties.
