In this connection it may be mentioned that the Farmers State Bank of Hannaford is offering to loan money at cost to farmers in this vicinity for the purpose of building a silo; the bank pays six per cent for money but are willing to loan it out again for this purpose at the same rate of interest. A silo is a good investment for any farmer, and within five years there will undoubtedly be as many silos in Griggs County as there now are barns.
