

OLE STROMME DECEASED

Ole Stromme, a pioneer settler of Broadview township, died at his home at Una, Sask., on Thursday, March 11. He came to this country from Norway in 1875, lived in Goodhue, Minn., for seven years, in the Red River valley for two years, and in Broadview township for twenty-seven years. Six or seven years ago he moved to Canada where he resided at the time of his death. The Una paper contains the following obituary notice:

The death occurred on Thursday last of Ole Stromme, one of the oldest settlers of Una district. Mr. Stromme, who was 68 years of age has been ailing for some time. The funeral took place yesterday afternoon. A service in Norwegian was conducted at the residence by M. Mossing, after which the remains were conveyed to the Una Hall, where a most impressive service was conducted by Rev. A. J. Heywood, assisted by Mr. Hagen, who spoke in Norwegian. "Peace perfect peace" and "Nearer my God to thee" were beautifully rendered by an octette of friends of the deceased, and the Una brass band rendered impressively several appropriate selections. The remains were interred in Una cemetery. Rev. Heywood conducted the service at the graveside. The deceased leaves one son Henry, to mourn his loss, to whom a wide circle of friends extends their sympathy.
