Hestella Pearl Werth, wife of Mr. August Werth, died at her home near Walum, Monday morning, April 17th, 1916, from heart trouble. Her demise came suddenly, although not unexpectedly, as her heart has given her considerable trouble for a number of years.

Hestella Pearl Pugh was born at Soldiers Grove, Crawford County, Wis., June 12, 1884. On November 11th, 1903, she was married to Mr. August Werth. To this union no children were born. She leaves behind her husband, her mother, one brother and one sister to mourn her death.
