Dazey Commercial: On Tuesday the special election for the purpose of issuing bonds for an electric light plant for Dazey was held and the proposition was overwhelmingly defeated. There was a total of 39 votes cast and 32 were against the proposition and 7 in favor of the bond issue.

Various causes are given for the defeat of the proposition. Some were against electric lights at all, the failure of crops to come up to anticipations caused some to vote against the measure, but by far the greater number voted against the issue because it was believed that the plant which had been accepted subject to the approval of the voters was not the kind which Dazey should have, particularly the engine which was to be furnished. A number also believed that the plant to be a success in Dazey should be private owned and not a municipal affair.

At any rate it is not likely that Dazey will have electric lights this year, but it is to be hoped that next year an individual can be interested in the proposition and that we will not be left behind the towns of the immediate vicinity.

A rumor is afloat this week of a possible new enterprise for Dazey. It is stated that a party from the Twin Cities is desirous of putting in a flour mill and in connection will install an electric light plant. We hope to get more details of the subject by next week. It certainly sounds almost too good to be true but we hope it may not turn out to be a dream.
