

## David T. Nelson at Fort Snelling

The Minneapolis Journal: "Everybody in England is raising something to relieve the food shortage," according to David T. Nelson of Mayville, N. D., one of the American students at Oxford, who has just returned to this country.

"Vegetable gardens are being started in London and the other cities and every effort is being made to keep the country supplied with foodstuffs."

"The people of the United States seem frightfully extravagant after England. For instance, one gets a fair portion of bread over here for breakfast. At luncheon, if one asks for more than one slice, all he gets is a pleasant smile. There are the same restrictions on other foods."

Mr. Nelson served under Herbert Hoover in Belgian relief work in 1914 and 1915 and has kept in touch with the situation in Belgium since, and also served some months with the American ambulance corps in France last summer. He has been designated to enter the reserve officers' training camp at Fort Snelling.
