With the death of Nicolai Swenson there passes the earliest pioneer of the southwestern part of Griggs county. He located in Dover township in 1881, coming there from Hillsboro. He has been closely identified with the affairs of his township, county and state, having held numerous local offices, has been treasurer of Griggs county for two

terms, and a member of the state legislature for one term. Deceased is survived by the wid-

ow and five children, three boys, Swen, Albert and Alvin; and two girls, Clara and Gladys. For some

years past the family had been making their home in Valley City to give the children the schooling advan-

tages of that city, and on account of Mr. Swenson's failing health, being unable to stand the rigors of active farm life.

The funeral was held Tuesday. Feb. 12, interment being made in

Eidfjord cemetery under the rites of the Lutheran church. Rev. P. A. Thoreson of Hannaford and Rev.

Neseth of Valley City were the officiating pastors. An unusually large crowd was present to pay their last respects to the departed dead.
