

Nick Cederson arrived home last week having completed his share of the work of chasing the kaiser to Holland. Nick has been only a short time in the service, but after only six days in a training camp in this country he volunteered to go to France though he had the privilege of remaining in this country for further training. He parook in several of the drives that ended the war and was in the Argonne when the armistice was signed. He was one of two soldiers in charge of an automatic rifle, and on one occasion when his company had advanced too far and exposed themselves to the enemy machine gunners, th/ two riflemen were compelled to abandon their

weapon as Nick's companion was shot through the leg and unable to walk. Nick took the man on his back and started for the American lines. On the way they ran into some German machine gun nests and were seen and fired upon and the man Nick was carrying was hit and killed. Nick managed to get back to the lines without any serious wounds although he has both shrapnel and machine gun bullet marks on him. The hardships endured by the boys in the Argonne were frightful and he states that he does not wish to go through it again under any circumstances.
