

A Splendid Opportunity To Obtain Education

Patrons and Friends of the Hannaford Special Schools District and Neighbors:

We all have observed that since the war no one has been satisfied with his present store of knowledge. The past three summers all the Universities and Colleges in the United States have had larger enrollments than ever before in history. In spite of the fact that a very large number of our young people were in government service, all schools were filled.

It costs a great deal to go away to schools. It always costs less to bring the school to the community. Many go away yearly to take commercial courses. Do you know that twenty could take the same course at home for what it would cost one to go away?

Now it is possible to get a commercial teacher for ten weeks, this winter. Our school is full in the day time but it could be used for the evening. A community should arrange to use this building as many hours each day as possible.

If there are twenty such people who want a Commercial course, they can have it for the cost of books, and pay for the instructor.

We are usually idle a great part of the winter months. We tend to deteriorate through idleness. This is a chance to be in one of the best social circles and improve your present store of knowledge.

I am not in a position now to tell you just what the expense will be, but I would estimate that if there are twenty who join the class we can figure on from twenty-five to thirty-five dollars apiece. This would give you fifty lessons in the commercial subjects.

Some may say, "O, I am too old to go to school." Well, I would say that none of us are too old to learn.

Farmers nowadays are compelled to keep a set of books for their business. They can use commercial arithmetic and commercial law. You can take a course in Penmanship from a very able instructor. We will plan to offer four subjects. You can take them all or any of the course that you like.

Now we wouldn't think of starting such a project before Dec. 10th. We would have a vacation for a week during the holidays; then school would close some time about March 1st.

Now, I wish you would think this project over and call the attention of your friends to the same. We may reasonably expect folks to join us from the neighboring towns. It matters not where you live if you can just get here—you are welcome.

Please call me up by phone or see me personally, or write me. Try to get in communication with me this week, so that I can know how many to plan for and can engage a teacher for the same.
