The Walum Young Peoples Society will meet at the home of H. G. Rohlwing Sunday evening, May 12. On account of the weather no meeting was held April 28th.

On Thursday afternoon a Boys and Girls Club was organized in the Walum Hall, composed of the children in the Walum and Gøplen schools, and any others who might wish to join. The only restriction made on membership is that the child must be 10 years old or over before next Christmas. The work of this organization is to plant war gardens, potatoes, corn, raise hogs or poultry and make full report of what was done to headquarters at Fargo early in December. The boy or girl winning first prize in the county will have his or her expenses paid to a short term course of a week at the Agricultural College at Fargo next winter by the county commissioners.

Axel Everson was elected president, Clara Haugen, vice-president, and Gerd Toenberg, secretary. County Superintendent Regner, Mr. Barton and County Agent Jackson gave short talks and arranged the organization.
