He has now more than a half section of valuable land, some of it well timbered, nearly all of it ~~timbered~~ ^{improved} with excellent buildings, good teams, etc. Mr. Mark was married in 1871, to Miss Grew Larson, daughter of Lars Thompson, a resident of Worth County, Iowa. She was born in Norway, in 1844, and came to America at the age of eighteen. They have two children - Beata and John. Mrs. Mark's father is deceased, her mother is now an inmate of Mr. Mark's family.
