

Nordhougen Raps Krueger's Record

TURTLE LAKE, N. D. (AP)—

Orris Nordhougen, Nonpartisan League candidate for Congress, attacked the voting record of Otto Krueger (R-ND) on REA and rural telephone legislation in a speech here Wednesday night.

Nordhougen and incumbent Rep. Usher L. Burdick, both NPL endorsees, are seeking Republican nomination in the June primary against Krueger and Charles Herman, the ROC candidates.

Nordhougen said that a tabulation of the voting records of all congressmen "revealed that the junior congressman from North Dakota voted against every single measure that was for the best interests of REA and its companion measure, RTA."

He cited as his authority the April, 1954, issue of the National Rural Electric Cooperative Assn., the official publication of REA co-ops, published at Washington.

Nordhougen stated that "on the other hand, the tabulation showed Usher Burdick has a 100 per cent record of voting right on each of
