

Nordhousgen Estate Report Is Approved

DEVILS LAKE, N. D. (AP)—After a hearing Thursday on the audit and final report of the estate of Hannah Nordhousgen Larson, District Judge Obert C. Teigen entered an order finding that her son, Orris G. Nordhousgen of Leeds, "has well and faithfully performed his duties as trustee and that his account is entitled to be approved and allowed."

Neither of the two other beneficiaries, her daughters Gladys Spoklie and Cora Medhus of Portland, Ore., appeared. There was no opposition to the report filed on his behalf by his attorney, Clyde Duffy of Devils Lake. Mrs. Medhus filed a letter expressing her satisfaction with the report.

Judge Teigen found that Nordhousgen, a Republican candidate for Congress, had made annual reports and settlements with his mother during her lifetime and that, after her death, he had administered the trust in accordance with its provisions, had made partial distributions from time to time and had his accounts audited by the Northwest Audit Co. of Fargo.

The resignation of Nordhousgen as trustee was accepted and his appointment of Carl Olson and Fred A. Krueger of the Northwest Audit Co. as successor trustees was approved.
