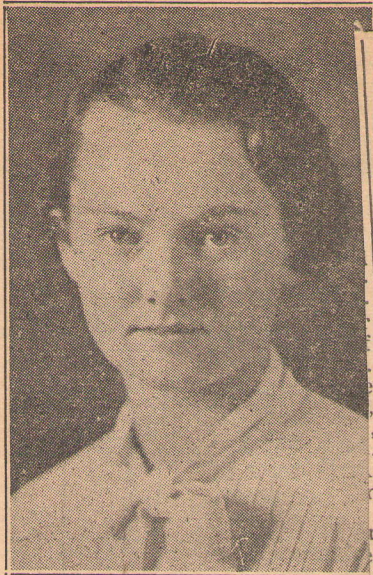


Valedictorian--

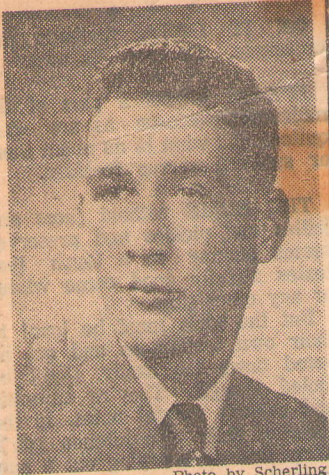
