Our School.

The Cooperstown public school will open this year on September ninth with the following instructors:

D. H. Loreaux, superintendent; Alberta Brackney, high school principal; Ruth Sisson, assistant principal; Marian Couperthwaite eighth grade; Viola Sidwell, sixth and seventh grades; Mabel Peterson, fourth and fifth grades; Mabel Belden, third and fourth grades; Nora McLeod, first and second grades; Jane Bodine, primary; Marie Hanson, music and drawing.

The board of education has made an earnest endeavor to secure teachers of experience and those especially qualified for their particular work.

Cooperstown has a first grade high school as classified by the State High School Board. Our graduates may now enter our state normal and university and similar institutions of north west states, without examination. Boys and girls of Cooperstown and vicinity may now be pre-

pared for college and for teaching right at home, with better conditions prevailing and at less expense, than in more remote schools.

Parents should have their children enter school the very first day.

We anticipate that several of the rooms will be crowded and we especially urge parents not living in Cooperstown, desiring their children to attend our city schools, to secure room and boarding for them at once and have them ready to begin school work the second Monday of September.

Books, tablets and the use of the library are furnished free of charge to all pupils. Non-resident pupils enter below the high school will be charged a tuition fee of five dollars per term of three months or a monthly fee of two dollars, due respectively, the first day of each term or the first day of each month. NO tuition will be charged any pupil in the high school.
