## MISSISSIPPI RIVER GIVES UP BODY OF OLE TUFTE, MOSE

WELL KNOWN AUTHORITIES ON LEVE STOCK WILL ATTEND MEETINGS ON JUNE 22-23-24, AT ALFALFA LAWN FARM

The news of the death of Ole Tufte, of Mose, was received here this week, from Minneapolis, where his body was recovered from the Mississippi river. His brother, Andrew, went to Minneapolis Monday and returned to Mose with the remains.

The body of a man believed to be Ole Tufte, 3001 University avenue, southeast, was found in the Mississippi river near the foot of Fifth avenue south, while Bert Morton, keeper of the morgue, was recovering the body of a young baby. Both bodies were taken to the morgue.

In one of the man's pockets was a letter giving Tutte's name and address and bearing an address, Mc-Henry, N. D. Inquiry at 3001 University avenue southeast brought out the fact that a man named Tufte had been living there. He left last Saturday, it was said. This man was believed to have a brother and sister in McHenry.

"The body of the baby was caught in a screen along with a quantity of debris. When the morgue keeper searched for it he found the body of the man also."

Funeral services were held at Mose yesterday.
