Baseball enthusiasts of McHenry are interested in forming a home players league, representing the towns of McHenry, Binford, Cooperstown, Hannaford, Sutton, Glenfield, Grace City, and Brantford. The plants similar to the one organized along the Soo line last season, and which, from all reports, proved very satisfactory.

The idea is to eliminate, as much as possible, the high-priced ball clubs which to some towns have become a burden. In this respect, however, Binford is one of the few fortunate ones in having practically a full team of home boys, with the exception of pitchers. Certain it is, no encouragement can be expected in the way of hiring more than one salaried player and even that is doubt-
