BOY FALLS 60 FEET AND LIVES Paul, 14-year-old son of Charles Brandenburg, of Sanborn, fell 60 eet when a lift in a grain elevator roke—and still lives, Bradenburg stepped on the lift and eleased the brake, operated by the loot. The lift was believed to be in its sual condition and was controlled. ecording to the weight carried, by he amount of pressure released or pplied by the foot brake. It is be-

leved that the youth did not underand the operation of the brake or else lost his presence of mind and pt his foot pressed on the brake, whose normal position would check the lift.
