or them. Aneta Panorama: A number of farmers have made the statement that they would raise more cattle if they could only afford to build more cow sheds. Thos. Brekke and son, Helmer, it would seem, have happily solved this problem by erecting a good cow shed on their farm south of town, of flax straw. Mr. Brekke states that a shed 20x20 was built by using two sets of posts about 18 inches apart, nailing on chicken wire and filling in between the wire covered posts with straw. Straw is also used for the roof. This would require very little lumber, if any, and make a cheap, but warm cow shed at the same time. Another way to build a shed is to have the flax baled and placed on top of each other, in the same manner as laying cement blocks, and then covering the seams with plas-"Where there's a will there's a way."
