## When's a Dog a Dog to be Decided by the Court

. Coming as it does from the pen of Editor Taylor of the LaMoure Chronicle who is chairman of the state game and fish commission, the fol-lowing comment may be of interest to Binford hunters:

North Dakota sportsman will await with keen inverted the outcome of a oriminal action gainst John Can-ham of Jam istown, who was agrested by Chief Geime Warden H. A. Brown and charged with having violated a und charged with having violated a state game law which prohibits the use of sertain highly of dogs while the owner is singaged in the gentle art of hunting game birds. Upon being halet into court, Mr. Canham waived examination, and thereupon was bound over to the county court

on his own bail.

The fact seems to be undisputed that Mr. Canham was hunting prairie chicken, and that a certain dog, towit, a water spaniel dog, was doing the same thing at the same time and in the same place. Mr. Canham, as we understand it, adm/ts that he is the owner in fee simple of the dog in question, but contends that netcher himself nor his dog was doing an unlawful act, innismuch as "the dog had just been refessed from his chain ... Ifp find a crippled chicken "

It is quize likely that this case will be fought right, up to the Supreme Court of North Dakota and that some mighty fine distinctions will be drawn by the various jurists who "cake a guess' on it. Fon the assue is by no means clear. Sec. 27 of the Game and Fish laws provides that-

'No person shall train or run any dos or dogs, owned or con-trolled by them, known as bird dogs, including pointers, setters or droppers, or allow same to Jun locke in fields or upon land which game blidle may be found, or are apt to be frequented by game birds between the first day of April and this first day of November (both inclusive tollowing of each year; provided however, that this section schall not be construed as prohibiting the use of dogs for retrieving water birds, including any or all of this bevenut species of ducks and geene, which it is lawful to hunt and kill."

Right at the outset we would this pectfully request that the court rules upon the grammatical construction of the phrase, "No person shall train or run any dog owned or controlled by chem." Also whather this phrase "both inclusive," is not redundant. As we understand it, a thing that is daclusive includes everything that & Webster's intended to be included. well known dictionary seems to agree with us on this paint, for A definess "includive" as "comprehending the Monday to Friday including, not form Monday to Friday including, not form Monday to Friday, BOTH inclusive. That, is nonsense

After disposing of these major con-

siderations, the court may very well take up the legal phases of the question. Obviously it will have to determine whather water speniess fall fato the "bird dug" class, and whether in any event the retrieving of a wounded prairie chicken by a spaniel violate, either the letter or the spirit of the law in such case made and provided. provided.

Whatever he the outcome of this litigation, we cannot too warmly commend Chief Game Walrdem Brown for his vigilance and diligence in the performance of his duties. In the menetatimes, hunters who go a quest-ing for prairie chicken will be on the safe side if they leave their dogs at home.
