In Griggs county there is apt to be a merry chase for the various officials positions. There will be a warm fight made particularly for the sheriff's office. Thus far four or five have been mentioned as possibilities or candidates for the position. Since Sheriff Nelson has served two terms he will not be eligible to run again this year. W. Wandke, Nels Moe, Carl Solberg, P. C. Paulson, all of Cooperstown, and Fred Lewis of Binford have already been mentioned as possible candidates for the office.

Thus far only one other county office has invited more candidates than the present official in charge. That exception is in the case of Clerk of Court, the office now held by Gundder Frignard. Edwin Bolkan is declared to be a candidate for the office.

As yet Auditor Melgard, Register

of Deeds Arnt Njaa, Judge Carleton, Attorney Sad and Superintendent Johnson have no opposition, though opposition is certain to develop. Rumor had it for a time that Ade Thompson would be a candidate for the office of states attorney for succeed John Sad. However, Mr. Thompson is said to have declared that if he did again undertake the practice of law it would not be here in this community. It is understood that all present county officials, other than the sheriff, will be candidates for re-election.
