BINFORD MAN INVENTS NEW FAN BRACKET

H. B. HANSON HAS PATENTED DEVICE TO ELIMINATE MUCH IGNITION TROUBLE ON FORD AUTOMOBILES

H. B. Hanson, of the Binford Auto Co., has perfected a fan bracket for Ford antomobiles which will eliminate at least 50 per cent of the ignition trouble common with that car. It is a very simple affair and when one considers that so much of the difficulty with Fords is due to the constant contact of the fan beit with the timer, it's strange that this improvement has not been invented before.

Many persons of an inventive turn of mind have invented parts for old Henry. Some have met with ready sale for a short time and then taken off the market, others have been impractical from the start, and a few can be classed as really good and are usually made a part of the equipment, which one must pay extra money for in order to enjoy the comforts of a larger car. In fact, there's so many new things for the Ford that it's common even for drug stores to handle some of them.

Mr. Hanson's invention can be classed among the practical ones. The models he has produced in the workshop and placed on cars has demonstrated, beyond a doubt, that every Ford owner will want to equip his car with this device.

The purpose of this bracket is to keep the fan-belt away from the timer. By so doing it removes the constant rubbing of the belt on the timer as is usually the case, especially when the belt becomes old and loose. With Mr. Hanson's invention the loose belt can be tightened which removes it still farther from the timer. It will mean that the timers on the Ford will last the life of the car.

Mr. Hasson has had his invention registered in the patent office in Washington and also has secured patent rights in Canada.

His partner, J. L. Moore, is associated with him in the manufacture and promotion of sales. They have been in correspondence with eastern companies and expect soon to contract for a large number and place them on the market. They hope to offer them to the public at a very nominal price.
