Joseph Ellis Jefferson was born at Gotcherick, Ontario, Novem-ber, 1856—died July 15, 1905. In early manhood he came

west and in 1881 located near Colgate, in Steele county, where he conducted a large farm for a number of years. On September, 1896, he was united in mar-riage to Mrs. Eliza McCormick, who survives him besides three children, a father, four brothers and two sisters.

Deceased was a member of several fraternal societies and was always active in promoting the spirit of good fellowship.
The funeral services are to be
held from the Congregational church at two o'clock this afternoon under the auspices of the Masonic fraternity, Rev. Hitch-cock preaching the sermon. The remains will be followed to their last resting in the cemetery west of town by the Masons, Woodof town by the Masons, Wood-men and a large concourse of sorrowing relatives and friends to pay their last tribute of respect to the departed.
