## COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS.

rose Twp. be repaired by the county, instead of building a new bridge. That the petition for a bridge between sections 19 and 30 Edendale Twp. be granted. That the petition for a bridge between sections 13 and 14 Broadlawn Twp. be granted. That the petition for a bridge between section 4 Colgate Twp. and section 34 Lincoln Twp. be granted, with an appropriation of \$150. for grading. That the petition for a bridge between sections 35 and 26 Colgate Twp. be granted. Signed by K. S. Sulland, H. N. Horner and W. E. Elliott, committee.

We, the Committee appointed to inspect grade sites petitioned for submit the following report. That the petition of Walter Swanson, L. Verwest and others, for a bridge and \$200. to help grade between sec 1 Melrose and sec 26 Easton Twps. be granted as follows. Instead of a bridge we grant 24 inch tile-fg. and appropriate the sum of \$150. to assist in grading down hills. That the petition of P. J. Hanson and others for an appropriation for grading on line between sections 1 and 12 Bergon Twp. be granted at \$100. That the petition of Andrew Rasmussen, Henry Palfrey and others for an appropriation for grading between sections 5 and 6 Willow Lake Twp. be granted at \$100. Said appropriations to be paid when the work is done to the satisfaction of the several town Boards. Signed, H. N. Horner, Frank Gray and G. O. Johnson, Committee.

We, the Committee, appointed to inspect grade site, for grading down hill, between sections 4 and 9, Hope Twp., submit the following. We grant the sum of \$50. on said grade, when the work is done to the satisfaction of the town Board. Signed Frank Gray, W. E. Elliott and H. N. Horner, committee. On motion the reports of the committees were approved and committees discharged.

On motion the County Auditor was ordered to advertise at once, for bids for repairs on old bridges and for construction of steel combination bridges, as follows:

No. 1 Repairs on bridge on line between sections 3 Edendale and 24 Primrose Twps.

No. 2 Repairs on bridge, on line between sections 23 and 26 Primrose Twp.

No. 3 A pile bridge, 20ft long, on line between sections 27 and 22 Primrose Twp.

No. 4 A pile bridge 30ft long, on line between sections 25 and 35 Colgate Twp.

No. 5 A pile bridge 32 ft long, on line between sections 12 and 18 Sherbrooke Twp.

No. 6 A pile bridge 40 ft long, on line between sections 33 and 26 Hope

No. 7 A pile bridge 42 ft long, on line between sections 13 and 14 Broadlawn Twp.

No. 8 A pile bridge 40 ft long, on line between section 4 colgate Twp. and section 34 Lincoln Twp.

No. 9 A tubular pile bridge 70 ft. long, on line between sections 5 and 8 Newburgh.

No. 10 A tubular pile bridge 45 ft long on line between sections 5 and 6 Primrose Twp.

No. 11 A pile bridge 32ft long, on line between sections 19 and 30 Edendale Twp.

Bids to be opened at 2 o'clock p. m. Feby. 9th 1904.

Bridge plans and specifications being on file in County Auditors Office.

The Committee appointed to check up the books of the Register of Deeds reported that they found the books and accounts satisfactory. On motion the report was accepted and committee discharged.
