The church is certainly a fine edifice and would do credit to most any city. The interior finishings and fixtures are of oak and the walls and ceiling are a fine production of the artist's art.

The altar is a most beautiful piece of work, and together with the scroll just above the arch bearing the inscription "Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus" makes the very pleasing and artistic effect. The building, together with the lots, as it stands, cost \$5,500.00, of which amount there is but \$1,500.00 yet to be paid.

Rev. Father Quillinan will have charge of the parishes at Casselton, Page and Hope, holding services at Casselton the first and third Sundays of each month, the second Sunday at Hope and the fourth at Page.

The Catholic society and the public in general may well feel proud that we have this splendid church edifice in our beautiful little city.
