Military Leaders of Byzantium Made Up by Finesse What They Lacked in Numbers.

After the decline of Rome the cener of the world's military progress was, for seven or eight centuries, Nels Albin left on Saturday transferred to the Greek empire. Constantinople ruled elements of a much less homogeneous nature than Rome, in her prime, had depended upon.

> The decisive military fact of the east was, however, that Byzantium had to contend against overwhelming numerical superiority in its enemies. South of it, from the Indies to the Atlantic, was the Saracen empire, burning with the zeal of a new religion. To the east were the Seljuk Turks, while to the north were the Hunic tribes.

Against such odds it was useless simply to match man for man. The military leaders of the empire were full of military spirit and took keen delight in war as a game; but they were the descendants of Ulysses, and of cleverness-in short, a war of wits.
