To Protect Wheat

An import duty of 35 cents a bushel on wheat is proposed in a bill soon to be introduced in Congress. The measure is designed to protect the American wheat grower from competition in Canada, Australia and other countries. This bill will be referred to the Ways and Means committee of the House. where it will be considered with other bills introduced for the relief of the agricultural situation. Congressman George M.
