and the record will show that they do not yield so well and are not so safe, but taking everything into consideration. Marquis is the most desirable wheat. Velvet Chaff lacks bread gluten and is too soft. Durum is a fine wheat for certain purposes, but has a limited market, there being a demand for not more than 10 per cent of the total spring wheat crop. The price of Durum is often 20 to 80 cents per bushel below the price of No. 1 Northern, which in itself is argument enough. This applies to the macaroni durums which should not be confused in any way with the so-called Red Durum, "Rust Proof" or Durum Fife wheat which has been making so much trouble and for which there is practically no market, and should not be seeded under any circumstances.
