### Southward Flow of Capital.

The flow of capital into the southern states continues at a tremendous rate, and if there is no check to the movement the next census will reveal some wonderful changes in that section of the republic. According to the Baltimore Manufacturers' Record, the money invested in new mining and manufacturing enterprises in the south since the 1st of January this year amounts to the great sum of \$55,504,000. The most of this has gone in the states of Alabama, Virginia, Kentucky, Texas, Tennessee and Florida, in the order named. The heaviest investments of capital have been in coal mining and iron manufacturing companies, though a considerable portion of this capital has, of course, gone into various other industries, such as cotton and wollen mills, flour mills, saw mills, machine shops, &c. In Alabama, more than in any other State, mining and iron making have been the favorite investments. The apparent fondness of North Carolinians for small enterprises is remarkable. There are more cotton mills in that State then in any other in the South, and yet, with two exceptions, they are small as compared with Georgia and South Carolina mills; and so it is in other branches of manufactures. Factories are increasing by the dozen, but most of them are of moderate dcapacity.

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
