Public Printer Benedict, who has made himself notorious by the wholesale dicharge of government clerks, will soon be tried in the furnace, to see if he himself is not wanting. argued, that unless Mr. Benedict could earn the average wages in a composing room, he could not be considered a practical printer. This he said, would be rating a practical printer very low.

A few days ago, Senator Mitchel! of Pennsylvania, asked the senate to pass a bill, giving a pension of \$2.000 a year to the widow of Senator Logan. The bill failed then, through the interterance of Senator Coke, of Texas, but yesterday it was brought to a vote and passed. The sum fixed is the same amount as that given to the widows of General Hancock and Thoamas.

It is probable that a new inauguration day will be determined upon by congress. Last June the senate voted to extend the President,s tirm of office to the last Tuesday in April, and also stipulate the last Tuesday to in April for the fourth of March, as the commencement and termination of the offical terms of Vice Presidents, Senators and Representatives. Some of the reasons given for this change were, that the first president was inaugurated on the 30th of April, that it would be a fitting celebration of George Washington.s inauguration, to inaugurate the president in 1889 upon the same day, and that the fourth of March as the day for installing a new government unduly curtails the second session of every congress.
