Where the Cigar get Its Name.

The origin of the word cigar is of some interest and is not to be found in the ordinary dictionaries. The word, of course, is Spanish, and Littre in his French dictionary says that it is derived from cigarra, the Spanish name for grasshopper. When the Spaniards first introduced tobacco into Spain from the Island of Cuba, in the sixteenth century. they cultivated the plant in their gardens. which in Spanish are called cigarrales. Each grew his tobacco in his cigarral and rolled it up for smoking, as he had learned from the Indians in the West Indies. When one offered a smoke to a friend he could say: "Es de mi ciggaral"-It is from my garden. Soon the expression came to be. "Este cigarroes de mi cigarral"—this cigar is from my garden. And from this the word eigar spread over the world. The name cigarral for garden comes from cigarra, a grasshopper, that insect being very common in Spain, and cigarral meaning the place where the cigarra sings. In this way the word cigar comes from cigarra, the name of the insect, not because it resembles the body of the grasshopper, but because it was grown in the place it frequents.
