

Daniel Clancy

Daniel Clancy Jr. of 145-63, was born on a farm in Winnebago Co. Wisc, Dec. 23, 1863. His ~~son~~^{father} Daniel Clancy was born in Ireland and came to New York state in 1851, where he married and he moved to Wisc. and farmed there the rest of his life. He married Mary Morarty, ^{who was} born in Ireland, and came to Orleans Co. New York with relatives.

Daniel Clancy Jr. was 5th in a family of 10 children and was raised on a Wisc farm. At 19 he left home and farmed in Wisc. about 3 years, and spent 2 winters in the lumber woods of northern Wisc. He went to Dak in the spring of 1885 and located in 145-63 - Foster Co. He built a sod shanty and hired a small acreage broken, and during the seasons of 1885 and 1886 worked for others. In 1887 he began farming for themselves with 2 horses, wagon, plow and pulverizer, and cultivated 4 acres of wheat and 20 acres of oats. The crop was frosted in 1888, light the following year and in 1890 he rented his farm and worked for others. He and his brother worked together in 1891 and they harvested 1200 bushels from 70 acres.

Mr. Clancy was married in 1893 to Miss Sarah Hoggarth, Of English descent, she was born in Canada, the daughter of Joseph Hoggarth who came

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America about 1845, and died at 70 years, in Foster Co where he came in 1886.

Daniel Clancy Jr: children are, Daniel, b. Apr. 5, 1894; Grace, born June 24, 1895, and James, born June 11, 1898.

Mr. Clancy, in the early days, hauled supplies from Melville, 22 miles; or Cooperstown 30 miles; and making a trip to Coopers, was overtaken on his return trip by a blizzard, and forced to return to Cooperstown, and it was 6 days before he could return home.
