According to the highway patrol, Olson and his son, William, 26, were traveling north on U. S. 85 some 2 miles north of Alexander about 6:30 Wednesday night when their car went out of control on an icy road and rolled over in the ditch. The elder Olson was thought to have been killed instantly.
